Key Stage 5 English Language Creative Writing workshops

Visit the Wallace Collection to discover a world of treasures to inspire your pupils' creative writing. Work with one of our professional authors to gather ideas and to research through studying historical objects and works of art. Pupils will learn how to use sources for their writing other than books and the internet.

Topics available:

- Dramatic monologues with some of the characters from the Wallace Collection portraits.
- Writing to inform – Travel Writing on the Grand Tour

Travel with the Wallace Collection on the Grand Tour! In the Eighteenth Century it was common for young people from rich families to travel around Europe to further their appreciation of the arts and other cultures. Today it is possible to travel around Europe with ease, but what would it have been like back in the 1700s? At the Wallace Collection students will work with one of our authors to look at some of the objects the travellers of the time would have taken with them, some of the objects they possibly might have brought back and paintings depicting some of the locations of the Grand Tour. See Venice of the 1730s through the famous paintings by Canaletto!

This is a **free** workshop providing students with the opportunity to work with a professional author for 4 hours (2 hours in the morning and 2 hours in the afternoon) in the galleries on creative writing activities inspired by the works of art and objects in the collection.
